- Call to Order- called to order virtually at 6:31.
- Approval of Minutes
- Principal's Report Steven Cotton
 - Ballet Quad Cities gave a great performance for October Anti-Bullying month. Dorothy Goes to
 Oz exceeded his expectations. Some studies viewed it live, some watched the live stream. Mr.
 Nelson went through the educational materials provided with students. Thanks to the PTA &
 Modern Woodman for sponsoring this event.
 - \circ Conferences will be Nov 1 12 as a mix of virtual and in-person.
 - Mr. Cotton has been monitoring the bus zone. Some buses are leaving by 3:10; others by 3:15/3:30. Bus 4 riders have been reassigned to other buses as there are not enough drivers. All kids are picked up from the pick-up lane by 3:15. There is a plan in pencil to resurface the parking lot next summer. They are looking at how to address getting cars off of Crow Creek Road.
- Treasurer's Report Erin Onions
 - Fall Fest netted around \$23,000. Mornings with Mom netted around \$5,000, although the mums bill still needs to be paid.
- President's Report Amy Featherstone
 - The streets by the Junior High (35th and Wisconsin) will be resurfaced and a round-about will be created through next summer.
 - COVID counts are on the website last week, Pleasant View reported 11. Mr. Cotton noted that the school sees a fair amount of students sent home on Mondays, and there are tests pending.
 - Enrollment numbers are showing around 200 additional students in the District this year.
 - Reflections is a National PTA program. This year's theme is "I can change the world by..."
 - The Winter Program has been postponed until spring. The spring band/choir performance will be moved up to 11/29/21 at 6 PM.
- Vice-President's Report Karyn Green, Megan Barone, & Susan Smith
 - The 6th grade students did an excellent job at Mornings with Mom. They were efficient and great at problem solving. Thanks to the students and their parents.

 - The book fair will be open to all, as well as an online option. The sales will result in Scholastic dollars for the school. Volunteers are needed for set-up and working the book fair.
